


Getting to Town







The University is the first in the Scotland and only the second in the UK to receive accreditation for its counselling, wellbeing & mental health services.

The Visa Process

- Accept an Unconditional offer as soon as you can
- The CAS process begins (from March/April). You'll need to:
 - Pay the deposit
 - Confirm your details on *My Visa Matters* section of Student Portal.
- Once confirmed, Registry will email the CAS number within 5 working days
- Use your CAS to apply for a visa as soon as possible



What is a CAS?

Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies

- This is an electronic certificate with a 14 digit number e.g. **E4G3HL5C18N0XX**
- This should not be confused with your Student ID number e.g.
 230044434
- Process starts in March/April

Visa Application

You will need:

- o your CAS number,
- o your expected travel date
- o Pay Application fee (£490)
- Pay Immigration Healthcare Surcharge (£776 per year, plus £388)
- Attend biometric appointment or upload photograph if using the IDV app
- Submit/Upload supporting documents (see your Supporting Document Checklist at end of application)





What Visa will I get?

Hard copy or digital visa?

- Face to face biometric appt: Visa Vignette in passport and will then collect a BRP card on arrival to the UK
- **Used IDV app**: Digital Status student can view and prove their Immigration status online:

https://www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status





Things to note

- Be able to pay for first year tuition fees and £9,207 living costs
- Some nationalities will need to submit financial documentation, transcripts and other documents
- Students not eligible to use the IDV biometric app <u>will be required</u> to submit their passport
- If getting a Biometric Resident Permit, you can collect from the University when you arrive (if using ACL code: 2HE357)

DO NOT travel to the UK (or book non-refundable flights) until you receive your visa

The NHS

- UK healthcare is provided by the NHS (universally known as the National Health Service).
- You cannot access a specialist without a referral from a primary care doctor (GP)
- For non-urgent care, we are used to waiting to see medical professionals.

Differences in provision

- Private care is available but not for all specialities.
- Check your health insurance/private healthcare provider to see if you are covered.
- Access to the NHS Mental Health Service is based on urgent care.

Before you arrive, get these vaccines: 2x MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) 1x Men ACWY (Meningitis A, C, W, Y) if under 25 years of age





Medication

If you are taking prescribed medication, find out ahead of time if it can be prescribed in the UK.

Bring with you:

- 3 6 months supply of current medication
- Guidance available from: <u>https://www.gov.uk/travelling-controlled-drugs</u>
- Medical evidence, confirming diagnosis from your physician, giving any medication information. Without this you will encounter delays obtaining further medication.
- Prescribed medication can only be prescribed by a UK doctor.
- Prescribed medication should not be mailed from overseas to the UK as it could be confiscated by UK Customs.





NHS Provision

All students must register with an NHS primary care practice (at matriculation) and obtain a UK SIM card for their mobile phone (to access local emergency services).

- 2 local GP (primary care) practices in St Andrews.
- Local Community Hospital 8am 6pm with Minor Injuries Service.
- Night-time telephone service (NHS 24) provides advice & referrals to in-person care.
- Pharmacist consultations (Minor Ailments Service).
- Specialist and emergency care Dundee (12 miles), Kirkcaldy (26 miles).
- The NHS work in a different clinical format.
- Check what UK treatment is offered before you come if you have a chronic condition.

Private care

- Local private GP practice.
- Some private hospital provisions in Edinburgh (52 miles).



University – NHS Partnership

- Student Health Hub based at the Community Hospital for any healthcare enquiries, we will signpost you to the appropriate health service and guide you through the process.
- Student health telephone line open during office hours.
- We work closely with both local NHS medical practices.
- Vaccination and public health awareness campaigns.




Where do our students go in the USA?

2016/17 - 2019/2020 graduates










