

Types of offer

- An **unconditional offer**. This means that you have already achieved the required grades or qualifications to study your selected course, and your offer has been confirmed.
- A **conditional offer**. This means your offer is conditional on you achieving certain grades or qualifications. Please check your offer letter for your specific offer conditions.

Respond to your offer

• Please refer to your offer letter, which will detail how to respond to your offer and any specific deadlines. We recommend that you accept your place as soon as possible.



Make the pre-payment



- Your offer letter will indicate if you are required to make a pre-payment to accept and secure your place. Your pre-payment will be deducted from the total cost of your tuition fees.

Apply for accommodation




- The online accommodation application form opens in March 2024 and you are encouraged to apply for accommodation as soon as possible.
- You can apply for University accommodation 48 hours after accepting an offer, regardless of whether your offer is conditional or unconditional.

Apply for a Student visa

- If you are an International student studying in the UK for more than six months, you will likely need to apply for a Student visa before you enter the UK.
- Find out more about how to apply for the Student visa.
- You can start the visa application process if you have accepted an unconditional offer and have received your CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies) number. Read more about the CAS number application process. Please be aware that you cannot apply for your visa more than six months before the start date of your course.
- If you have accepted a conditional offer, you will be able to apply for the visa if you meet the conditions of your offer and your place is confirmed and you have received your CAS number. Please check your offer conditions carefully in your offer letter.


