

Where to get further help

If you have been trying to conceive for a while without medical help, your first step will be to visit your General Practitioner who can arrange some fertility investigations and refer you to a fertility specialist if applicable.

You could also visit the HFEA website and access the 'Choose a Fertility Clinic' feature, which will give you access to all licensed in the UK.

How to get the most out of your GP appointment

Things to consider...

- **Keep a record** of your last 6 months of menstrual cycles (if applicable).
- Ask for your GP to refer you for fertility testing inc. AMH (Anti Mullerian Hormone), FSH (Follicle Stimulating Hormone), LH (Lutenising Hormone) and progesterone blood tests. If you have a male partner, ask for a referral for a semen analysis.
- · Ask your GP what the funding criteria is for fertility treatment in your area.
