# PH5536: RECENT TOPICS IN METAPHYSICS

This course will focus on issues in contemporary metaphysics related to the existence and structure of objects. How many things are there? When – if ever – does a thing have parts? Are things individuated — and if so, how? The course has three main aims: (i) to be an introduction to *metaphysics* as it is done in contemporary 'analytic' philosophy; to give you a working knowledge of many rival theories regarding the nature and number of objects; and to introduce you to some useful formal tools (e.g. plural logic, mereology, topology).
